


Mentorship Programs Offered in the Maids of Athena

Maid to Lead Program established in 2016

M2L (Maid to Lead) Program

- Identifies strong sisters in the Maids of Athena who show potential to become leaders within the organization
- Each Grand Lodge Officer acts as the head of a set committee, helping guide and teach 3-5 members, while also focusing on ways to improve the Maids of Athena and its goals.



- They attend a meeting at AHEPA National Headquarters to discuss leadership within the organization and ways to take the Maids of Athena to new heights.

Dual Membership

- Per the Daughters of Penelope Constitution, a MOA, at the time she turns 23 must hold dual membership in the MOA & the Daughters of Penelope.
- The caveat of this progression is simple and this is where we bridge the gap.
- #1 Look at your MOA rosters and highlight those that are 23 years of age and above.
- #2 Plan the initiation into the DOP as a memorable one for our young ladies and keep traditions alive. This is what they will remember.
- #3 Continue to be open to new and fresh ideas without telling them what to do or this is how we do it.... there are many ways we can learn from each other and accomplish our goals
- #4 Dues: \$20.00 a year in the Maids of Athena + \$15.00 initiation fee as a Daughter = \$35.00 to be a member of both Orders for the first year.
- Our young women DO NOT pay DOP dues until they age out at 28 from the Maids of Athena.

I understand it is my responsibility to show proof of membership in "good standing" to **both** the primary and secondary chapters on a **yearly basis** to be eligible to hold dual membership. A member may belong to no more than two chapters. Members must pay full dues to the primary chapter and only chapter dues to secondary chapter. She can only represent her primary chapter at a District or National Convention and must meet all requirements for a delegate. A member shall be eligible to serve in any elected position only in her primary chapter. (Constitution-Article V; Section 1; c)

TIPS & SUGGESTIONS

Establish a relationship of trust and sisterhood with the girls

You are their mentor and someone they can confide in for guidance, assistance and encouragement

Be supportive & proactive - but please do not be demanding – they should feel empowered and run their own meetings.

Act impartially and guide them with their duties - act as a Parliamentarian – follow the Constitution and Rituals during their meetings

Supervise, not babysit, all the activities of the Maids of Athena chapter you are advising

Act as a liaison between the MOA chapter and the DOP chapter by presenting monthly updates at your DOP chapter meetings, ensure rosters are up to date & plan dual membership initiations into the DOP
