

I was born in Athens, Greece. I came to the United States in 1963 and received my Bachelor of Science Degree in Education, in 1972. I received my Master's Degree in Education in 1984.

I taught elementary education in MA, for 24 years. I have been a member of the NEA, EAW, FTA, TESOL, and I am also certified in Bilingual Education. I taught Greek and English in the public school system. I was appointed Bilingual Curriculum Coordinator for all languages in the city of Worcester, MA.

We hosted a District Convention and I served as Convention Treasurer at that time. I have been the Scholarship chairperson since 2000. I have served as District Convention chairperson and secretary. Recently, I was instrumental in establishing the St. Petersburg AHEPA/Daughters of Penelope Scholarship Foundation and served as a Chairperson the past year.
