Executive Summary

The Daughters of Penelope play an important role in the community. This year the Daughters of Penelope will be focusing on raising funds for the rebuilding of the St. Nicholas Shrine as a part of the Grand President's Project.

Always Remember, Never Forget

The horrific events of September 11, 2001 have touched all of us in some way. Some more personal than others but, none the less the destruction that took place in New York City, Washington, DC and Pennsylvania will be embedded in our minds and hearts forever.

St. Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church was founded in 1916 by Greek American Immigrants and stood for eight-five years. Serving the Greek Orthodox faithful and also providing non-Orthodox with a quit space to pray, think or light a candle before going off to work at the WTC. With the collapse of World Trade Center Tower Two, St. Nicholas Church was the only house of worship destroyed that day.

We were all overwhelmed, shocked and in disbelief on that day. However, out of the ashes of the World Trade Center, amongst the rubble, stood a cross giving us hope and faith. As a DOP Family, we can stand together in Christ in helping to rebuild St. Nicholas at Ground Zero.

Rebuilding St. Nicholas National Shrine at Ground Zero

The Saint Nicholas National Shrine at Ground Zero will be the only house of worship in the entire sixteen acre rebuilt World Trade Center. The parish will continue to function however; it will also be a National Shrine of the Holy Archdiocese of America. Its doors will be open to all to light a candle, say a prayer or meditate.

Designed by architect Santiago Calatrava, his inspiration was drawn from Byzantine architecture of the past which includes The Church of the Holy Savior in Chora and Hagia Sophia, in Istanbul, Turkey.

Sitting high on a hill, adjacent to the 911 Memorial, this all white church will stand out amongst the black and grey skyscrapers. The Church will be constructed in the elevated Liberty Park. The landscaped forecourt will provide a gathering space for visitors with sweeping views that overlook the Ground Zero memorials and museum.

How You Can Contribute

For those chapters who are energetic, consider turning this fundraising effort into a yearly event for other DOP programs! Your chapter can host events throughout the entire year to promote the great work of DOP. Whichever you choose, we hope you have a truly rewarding and successful program!

Objectives

DOP will spearhead a three pronged approach to collecting funds.

- 1. DOP will reach out to each chapter/district with financial goals.
- 2. DOP will reach out via its contacts in the Greek American community to approach Greek Americans/Companies to assist in the rebuilding.
- 3. DOP will initiate an internet campaign to the Greek American community as a whole.

What to Know

1. It is important to remember that many of the people attending may be paying by cash for this event so making a receipt available may not be easy. Sample Press Release

Local Greek American Community Fundraises to Help Build National Shrine at Ground Zero Site

RELEASE DATE: September 1, 2015

CITY, STATE - The local chapter of the nation's leading association for Greek Americans and Philhellenes, the Daughters of Penelope (DOP), will support the campaign to build Saint Nicholas National Shrine at Ground Zero, New York City, by hosting a fundraising event on [DATE], [LOCATION]. The event is open to the public.

DOP (Chapter Name) Chapter [No.], [CITY], will join with more than 300 of its fellow chapters worldwide in hosting a pancake breakfast [OR FUNDRAISING EVENT] on December 6 (the Feast Day of Saint Nicholas) to raise funds toward the construction of the National Shrine. The original Saint Nicholas Greek Orthodox Church was the only House of Worship destroyed on September 11 and will be rebuilt as a National Shrine for everyone to patronize.

"The Saint Nicholas National Shrine at Ground Zero will be a place of patronage for individuals of all faiths and background," Chapter President [FULL NAME] said. A Ground Blessing for the Saint Nicholas National Shrine at Ground Zero was held Oct. 18, 2014.

Founded in San Francisco in 1929, the Daughters of Penelope is the first women's organization of its kind established in the United States. It is an affiliate organization of the American Hellenic Educational Progressive Association (DOP).

Strategy and Implementation

The goal of the Daughters of Penelope is to raise \$100,000 towards this endeavor through funds raised by the districts, chapters, individuals and corporations. As a district/chapter your contributions will play a vital role in our efforts. Would you kindly consider hosting a fundraiser and donating the proceeds to this worthy cause? Listed are some suggestions you may wish to consider.

Host a Communion Breakfast for Children on December 6, which is St. Nicholas Day or a day of your choice.

Pictures with Santa: You will need a Santa, digital camera, color printer, photo paper and a festive back drop.

Lunch with Santa: Work with your local fast food burger shop order kid's meals. You could also add pictures with Santa.

Host a Spelling Bee for Children: Ask participants to solicit donations for the amount of words they spell correctly. Remember to start off with easy words. You can award the winner a gift certificate to the movies. You could also charge a nominal fee for guest to watch the spelling bee.

Guess the Number of Sweets in the Jar: What kid doesn't like candy, fill a very large jar with different types of candy and charge each child a \$1 for a chance to guess the number of pieces of candy in the jar. Of course the child who guesses correctly wins the jar full of candy.

Bargain Prom Gowns: Sell gently worn prom dresses at a discount price. Ask for donations of used evening gowns, cocktail dresses & brides- maid dresses. Put flyers up in local schools, church, supermarkets etc. Advertise on your local TV & radio stations & local newspaper, some may do it for free since it is for charity. Hold the shopping day at least one month prior to Prom Season and sell dresses for \$20-\$50. Make sure you have a large space, fitting room area and a full length mirror.

Host an Ice Cream Social for Children and Families: You provide the ice cream and toppings and let the participants make their own sundaes.

Host a Bowl-a-thon for Kids: Ask participant to solicit for donations. Make sure you request the bumper guards so ever pin gets knocked down.
