**DOP Headquarters Report**-presented by Elena Saviolakis, Executive Director. Thanked staff at Headquarters, Grand Lodge officers, Legislative Consultant Andrew Kaffes. Please continue to visit the website at [daughtersofpenelope.org](http://daughtersofpenelope.org) for publications, guides, forms, membership system, news and events. Be aware per capita is the main source of funding to function as an international women's organization. Under the leadership of Grand President Kathy Bizoukas, the DOP had a very productive year. In March Kathy and Elena met at the National Headquarters of Meals on Wheels and presented a check of \$10,000 on behalf of the DOP. The donation was made possible by the late Mr. Nicholas Economy and AHEPA National Housing Corporation. A significant mission moment where DOP realized the need to address senior isolation and hunger. GP Kathy traveled, as was feasible to attend Chapter and District workshops, conferences, and conventions throughout the DOP domain as well as events to create outside exposure to the DOP. GP Kathy cultivated a relationship with her U.S. Representative Frank Mrvan. In January, she introduced him to DOP, its policy priorities and how DOP programs serve to strengthen our society. Elena is thankful and blessed to call her a Sister and a friend.

### **AD HOC COMMITTEE REPORT**
